CALL FOR PANEL PROPOSALS, PAPERS, POSTERS, AND FILMS

Dear colleagues.

After the success of the 1st AIBR International Conference of Anthropology, The Network of Iberoamerican Anthropologists and the *Grup de Recerca Sobre Exclusió i Control Socials (GRECS)* of the University of Barcelona are glad to present the 2nd edition of the conference with the theme "Identity: Bridges, Thresholds, and Barriers", which will take place between the 6th and 9th of September of 2016 in the beautiful city of Barcelona, Spain. The experience of the 1st conference in Madrid made clear that there is a need to convene an annual meeting that can serve to espouse the discipline's academic principles among all different countries around the World.

With an open program featuring more than 200 thematic sessions, the 2nd AIBR International Conference of Anthropology is a general call for specialists in our discipline, as well as for those who are interested in knowing more about Human Beings, both biologically as socially and culturally.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

1. Dates: Deadline for the late breaker paper and panel submission: February 28, 2016.
2. Types of papers and presentations: There are three different options:
 - Papers in oral Presentations: Each presenter will be given a maximum time of 15 minutes. Each lecture shall be performed by one person only. Participants are restricted to two papers.
 - Films: Maximum length is 100 minutes. The Scientific Committee may request the complete film for evaluation.
 - Posters.
3. Submissions: Every paper will require a title, an abstract (max. 250 words), keywords (max. 5), and the author will choose the main topic from a list of given options. Abstracts shall have no authorship references. There is no need to send the complete text of the work. Please revise carefully the orthography, style, technical vocabulary and contents of the abstract, since in case the paper is accepted this is the information that will be finally published in the book of abstracts.
4. Languages: All papers should be written in one of the four official languages of the conference: English, Spanish, Portuguese or Catalan. All the papers that are part of a specific panel should be written only in one language.
5. Panels: Papers will be organized in panels of a minimum of 4 papers and a maximum of 6 with a common topic/panel title. Each panel will have a coordinator in charge of moderating the times, interventions, and of leading the final debate after the presentations. The coordinator may or may not present a paper. Panels can be proposed individually if a coordinator has

previously contacted the participants, or they can be proposed by the organization of the conference in accordance with the contents of individual communications. If a submitted paper is part of a panel, the author will indicate this aspect in the registration form. In such case the authors shall know the title of the panel and the name of the coordinator when completing the submission form. All the papers that are part of a specific panel shall be presented in the same language.

6. Authorship: Although a paper can bear more than one signature, each paper shall be performed by one person only. In order to receive a certificate of authorship, the co-authors shall be registered in the conference. If the first author cannot attend the conference, the organization will not be in charge of reading the paper. Only the author or a co-author registered in the conference will be allowed to present the paper.
7. Evaluation: The scientific committee will review the papers by using a double blind system. In case of a tie there will be a third opinion. Once the papers have been accepted, the authors will be given one month to complete the conference registration (by May 31st, 2016). The papers whose authors have not been registered after that date will be drop from the program. Panels will only be kept in the program if they include at least 4 admitted papers.
8. Topics: The conference is open to all of the discipline's fields: Applied Anthropology, Sociocultural Anthropology, Linguistics, Biological Anthropology and Archaeology.
